

OVERVIEW Pain is a major problem in the majority of the aging population because it slows recovery, causes many complications, increases the cost of healthcare, and negatively affects quality of life. Home health aides must understand the issues directly and indirectly related to pain, such as what causes it and how it can be relieved, in order to preserve the physical, functional, cognitive, emotional, and social well-being in their patients.
