

Harriet Jacobs was born a slave in North Carolina in 1813 and became a fugitive in the 1830s. She recorded her triumphant struggle for freedom in an autobiography that was published in 1861. As Linda Brent, the books heroine and narrator, Jacobs recounts the history of her family, the degradation of slavery and the sexual oppression she found. She portrays a supportive black community and sympathetic whites, including the northern woman who employed her and eventually bought her freedom.
